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Provence

Explore the city on foot, then indulge in a unique olive oil and chocolate tasting featuring local flavors. In Aix-en-Provence, browse lively markets filled with lavender and artisanal cheeses before crafting your own perfume or sampling wines at nearby vineyards. Wander Avignon's medieval streets, take a hands-on Provençal cooking class or hike through the Alpilles and Luberon mountains for sweeping countryside views.
